Fun With Bubbles

Ingredients:

2 cups of water

3/4 cup of dish soap (Dawn works best)

4 tablespoons of Light Corn Syrup

Mix ingredients in bowl; stir slowly.

You can add food coloring to give your bubbles.

Try different things as bubble blowers:

Fly swatters

Bend pipe cleaners into any shape

Make large loops with string or coat hangars

Berry baskets

Flubber

Materials:

Glue

2 large plastic cups

Borax

2 stirring sticks

Food Coloring

small mixing bowl

Water (Room Temperature)

Directions:

In one cup, mix 1/4 cup of glue, 1/4 cup of water and a few drops of coloring.

In a second cup, mix 1/2 cup of water and 2 spoonfuls of Borax.

Pour both cups into the small bowl and stir until it balls up on the stir stick.

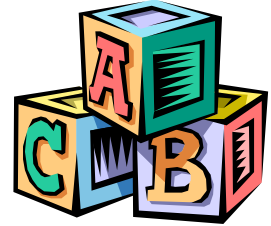
Take your flubber out of the bowl and squeeze the extra water out with your hands.

Important note: Adult supervision and participation is required for these activities.

Kool-Aid Play Dough

Ingredients:

- 2 cups of flour
- 1/2 cup of salt
- 2 packages of unsweetened Kool-Aid
- 4 tablespoons of Cream of Tartar
- 2 cups warm water
- 4 tablespoons vegetable oil



Directions:

1. Mix the dry ingredients in bowl.
2. Add the warm water and vegetable oil and mix well.
3. Place ingredients in frying pan and cook over medium heat, stirring for 3-5 minutes until it forms a ball.
4. Knead play dough once it cools enough to handle.
5. Store in air tight container

Ocean Bottles

Materials:

- Vegetable Oil
- Food Coloring
- Water
- Empty pop bottle or jar with lid
- Glitter (optional)

Directions:

1. Fill bottle 2/3 full with water.
2. Add food coloring and glitter.
3. Fill rest of bottle with oil.
4. Put the lid on bottle tight.
5. Shake bottle and watch the oil and water separate slowly.

Important note: Adult supervision and participation is required for this activity.
