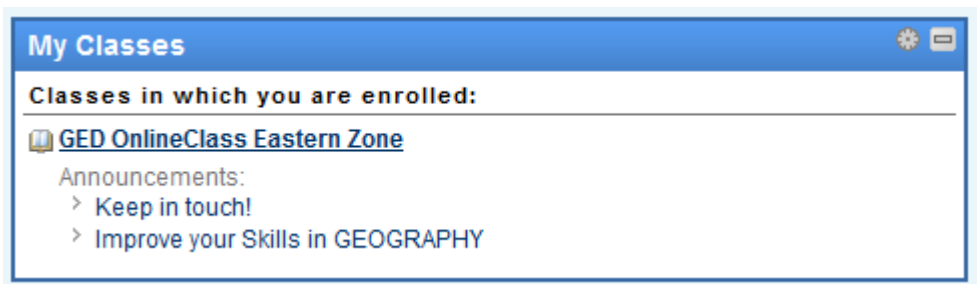
Begin by accessing the GED OnlineClass web site at www.montanaged.com

Click on Student Login to access the system

You login to Blackboard using your username and password assigned to you by your online teacher. Blackboard is case sensitive and needs to be typed exactly how it was given to you.

Once you login, your classes will show up in the My Classes module located on the right of your screen.

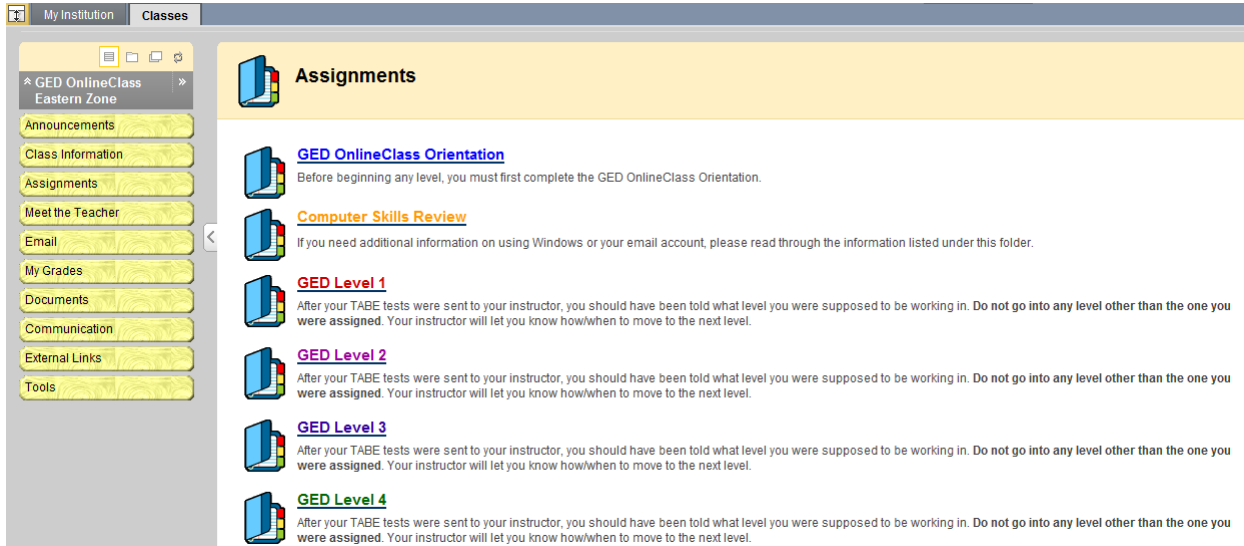


Click the class name to enter the appropriate class.

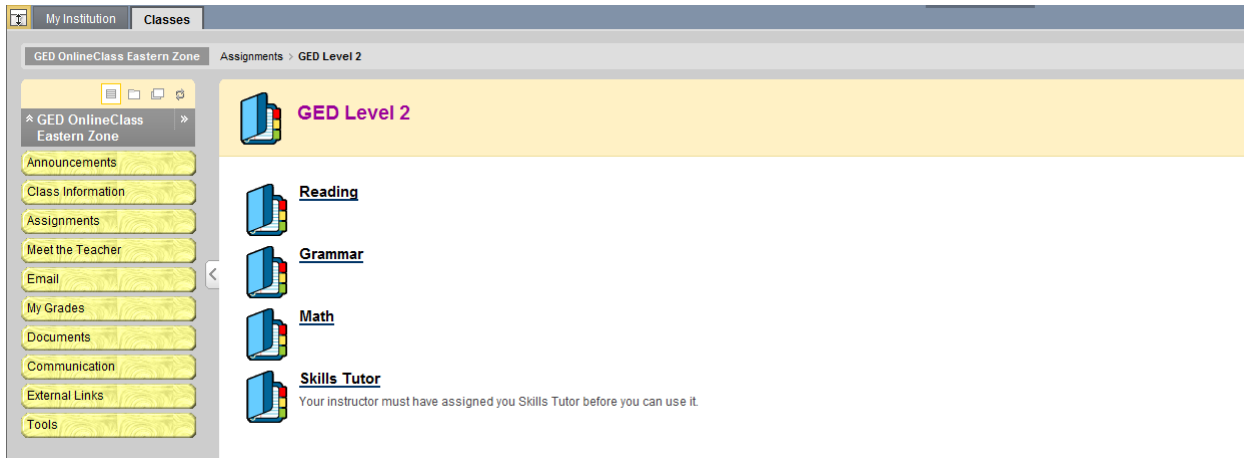
You will be directed to the announcement page for the selected class



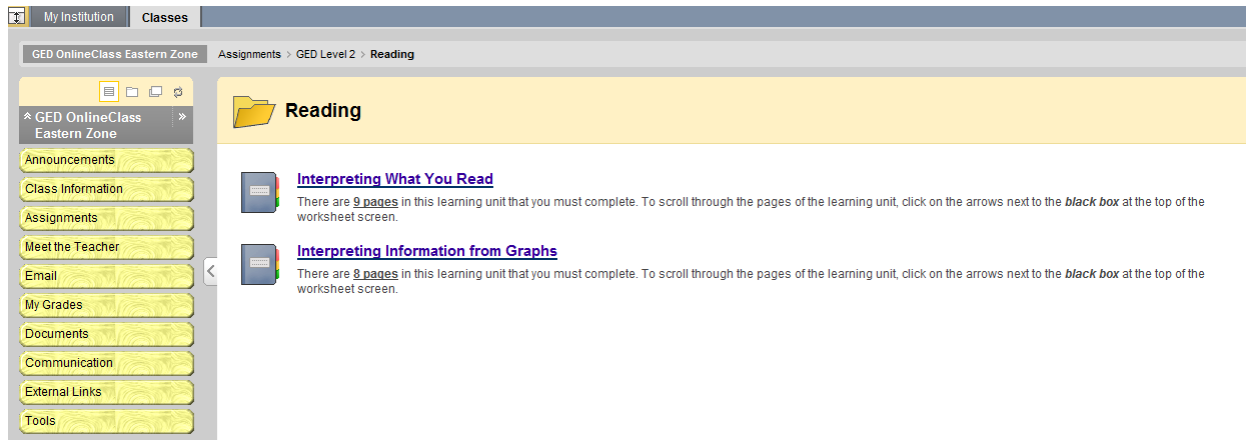
Click the Assignment Tab on the left of your screen to access the curriculum.



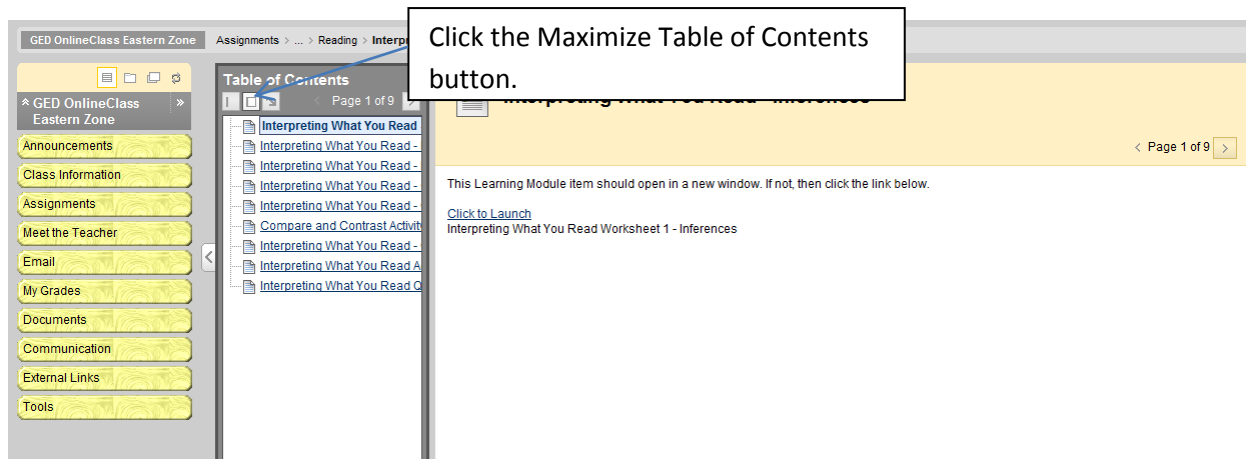
Your instructor will let you know which Level to complete. Click the appropriate level to begin.



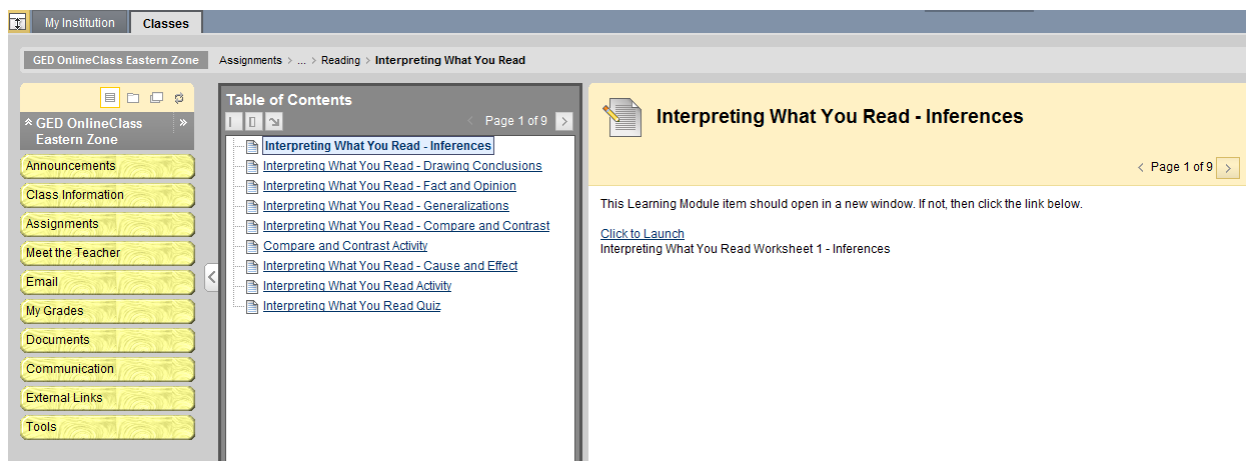
Within each level are subjects. Click the subject assigned by your instructor.

You will need to be able to read between the lines to make inferences, be able to draw conclusions, and take the knowledge that you already have and apply it to what you are reading.
