

HOW TO ENROLL:

- Complete the admissions application.
- Submit transcripts from the last high school attended and previous colleges attended (if any).
- Arrange to take the American College Test (ACT). This test is not required for admission.
- Students applying for admission to the Nursing program must contact the program director.

FINANCIAL AID:

Financial aid is available in the form of Federal Pell Grants; Federal Supplemental Educational Opportunity Grants (FSEOG); Leveraging Educational Assistance Partnership Program (LEAPP); Federal Work Study (FWS); Institutional Student Employment; WWC Foundation Civic Grants and Scholarships and WWCC Grants and Scholarships. 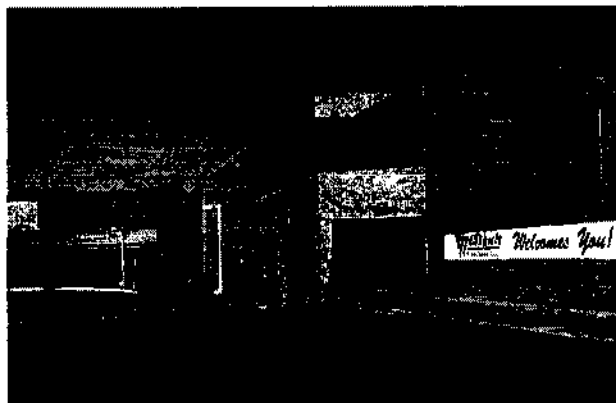
